Scrub Trip March 27 2004 by Ranger Sheila Barnes

Would you like to hike the same trails that Marjorie Rawlings walked when she was writing "The Yearling"? Do you want to see where the Baxters lived, where Jody built his flutter mill, the sinkhole where they got their water, and the prairie where Ol' Slewfoot was slain?

If so, please note that staff of the MKRHSP will be conducting a day-long venture into the very locations in the Ocala National Forest that were depicted in her novel. We read excerpts from "The Yearling" throughout the program.

To participate, you must be able to walk 2+ miles in shifting sand, on uneven terrain with up and down grades, and no amenities. It is a wilderness area. You will have to hop over downed trees, take your leave in the bushes, and carry drinking water.

This is a full day program. We meet at the parking lot of the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park. We car pool and leave <u>promptly</u> at 9:00 AM. We will hike into Pat's Island, picnic and swim at Silver Glen Springs, and visit Hopkins Prairie on the route back. Arrival time back at MKRHSP is approximately 4:00 PM.

We provide a big cooler, cups, ice, and first aid supplies. You bring a packed lunch, drinking water, bug spray, bathing suit and towel, and \$4 admission fee to Silver Glen Springs. Layer your clothing and wear sturdy walking shoes.

To sign up for this program, contact the park at (352) 466-3672 and leave your name and phone number, and the number of participants in your party, on our answering machine. Just say you are joining the Scrub Trip. Hope to see you on the trails!

Many thanks to everyone that came out on an incredibly beautiful weekend day to work!














Cross Creek Quilters By Murray Laurie

≶Jacob's Ladder Quilt

When Head Ranger Sheila Barnes embarked two years ago on a project to sew a quilt made up mostly of scraps of cloth left over from the house dresses and aprons worn at the Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings Historic State Park, she chose the Jacob's Ladder pattern. (Those familiar with the Rawlings works will recognize this as the title of one of her early literary masterpieces.) Small squares of cotton in a rainbow of colors climb up and down the top of the quilt, each hand-stitched in place. Sheila then bound the patterned top, the inner cotton batting, and solid muslin backing together in a swirling pattern of tiny, even stitches. She credits her mentor, Judy Baker, a master of traditional quilting techniques, for her guidance.

Park staff member Pam Morrison's original small quilted wall hanging was the hit of the MKRHSP staff Christmas party. A view of the back porch entrance to the Rawlings house, complete with palm trees in the distance and Sheila Barnes picking tangerines from the yard tree, was stitched in a collage of cotton fabric designed to delight the eye. A tiny quilt pinned to the clothesline echoed the quilt Sheila had been working on so steadily for the past two years.
